Overlooked

It isn't easy to be overlooked, especially when you are 6 foot 3 inches tall! But, one of my greatest struggles of living in this region of the Midwest is a feeling of being overlooked.

I watch the evening news to find out what kind of weather we will have, only to witness the weather person positioning himself directly over St Croix County. Often, when tuning in to hear about school closings, the news anchor will give a full report that will end at the border. I tune in to hear reports on important election events and can't get a single posing of candidates from our county, region or state. I can easily identify Governors, Legislators and many department heads from outside our state, but I need to resort to surfing the internet or subscribe to a day-old paper to get any sort of report about our great state. Even a new "digital" antenna won't work, because the towers east of here can't be detected. (Thank you to all the 4-H sign makers for keeping me updated on the County Fair!)

The phenomenon isn't only in the media. I've contacted Regional Coordinators in St. Paul about resources available to congregations, but I have to speak to representatives in Chicago because St Paul is in Region 3 and we are on the other side of the line – in Region 5. Even the coordinators struggle with the "line of demarcation" because we are so far "out there." It complicates schedules and resources. I'm being – we're being - overlooked!!!

Recently, our Executive Council leaders met with a Thrivent Financial for Lutherans agent. (*Thrivent is a faith-based, not-for-profit membership organization nearly 2.6 million members strong. It is a Fortune 500 financial services organization with the strength of more than \$67 billion in assets under management.*) We held the meeting because our congregation has not been receiving many of the resources that Thrivent has provided to other Lutheran congregations in our county, conference, or synod. The good news is that we are now on the radar. And it's a good thing, because Thrivent has amended the way they provide support to many projects.

Thrivent (with headquarters in Appleton, WI and Minneapolis, MN) claims to be "the nation's largest fraternal benefit society" and yet many of the people in our community don't know this. Thrivent is a relatively new merger (2001) of two long-time agencies in the fraternal benefit society - Lutheran Brotherhood (started in 1917) and Aid Association for Lutherans (started in 1902). Our community had agents from both companies working in it and both provided resources and products to members of our area Lutheran churches.

With the merger came CHANGES. With the changes came new lines of demarcation. And some areas got, kind of, well, overlooked...

We are now entering a new relationship with Thrivent, and we have to! The one program many of you may know about is the Thrivent Matching Funds shared in our community – with little or no more requirement than to ask for the funds and then plan an event. This program has been rewritten and new criteria have been set for the disbursement of the Thrivent funds.

Thrivent has a whole lot of resources to offer our members and our congregation. Over the next few months, representatives from Thrivent will be introducing themselves to our congregation at our services. We will hear about many of the programs that Thrivent offers that can help our members budget their income, plan for their children's education, or plan for their retirement. Thrivent programs can assist our congregation with our financial investments. Thrivent can help our community reach out to people.

We can't change the fact that we get overlooked. Even the God we worship gets overlooked! But then there are people that are called "Proclaimers" who bring news... good news. It is my prayer that our people will hear what Jesus Christ and our scriptures tell us of our God who is often overlooked - that our God has good news for all his people.

Help me help others notice our God. We are chosen to take up the challenge and to proclaim the message of salvation! (Isaiah 52:7) "How beautiful on the mountains are the feet of those who bring good news, who proclaim peace, who bring good tidings, who proclaim salvation, who say to Zion, "Your God reigns!"

Hey, all of you that are feeling overlooked, "Your God reigns!"

...my perspective (words from our President)

A Strong History

It's a quiet secret that most don't know about me. Shhhh, don't tell anyone but . . . I love family history. I have been researching my family history for over 10 years. In that time, I have visited great aunts and uncles, grandparents and distant cousins. I have seen faded pictures of great-great grandparents. I have browsed the yellowed pages of old family Bibles. I've heard the many stories about days-gone-by. I was surprised to find out that my grandmother was one of the first taxi drivers in Madison, WI (when it wasn't cool for a woman to drive) and that my great-grandparents sold "mean geese" on their farm. It's been an adventure that has given me a great deal of pleasure and excitement.

I have also discovered that both sides of my family have a strong German Lutheran history running through them. Just recently, I was going through a box of things from my grandmother and found that she had a copy of Luther's Morning Prayer and Evening Prayer (which can be found in a hymnal). I now have that copy at my bedside - as I'm sure my grandmother did. I have found that some of my ancestors left the home country because of religious persecution and came to America to worship freely (around 1840). I have also found that I am related to eight of the twelve founding families of a Lutheran congregation in southern WI. It is clear that I have a heavy heritage of strong Lutheran ancestors. They were convicted in their faith and understanding of scripture. It was a part of who they were, and it's a part of who I am.

The history of our congregation is just as strong. The local, hardworking men and women - who were strong in their faith - felt a great need for a Lutheran church in the area. (Check out the pictures of the early members on the wall near the new addition). Of course, through the years, there were many changes and the two churches on County Rd. N joined together and became the congregation we are today - Peace LUTHERAN Church. Our beliefs are still based on scripture and scripture alone. The Book of Concord, which was written in 1580 and includes the Lutheran Confessions, is the standard for what Lutheranism is.

A strong foundation built because of the hard work and Christian beliefs of many have gotten us to where we are today. We can learn a lot from our ancestors (those in our family and those who came before us in our church family). They read their Bibles, attended worship regularly, fellowshiped with each other and prayed for each other. Yes, we can learn a lot from them.

Now where did I leave my address book? I have a distant aunt to call.

Call to Order – President Tracy Carlson called the meeting to order at 7:00p.m. The attendance sheet was passed around. Joy Grognet led devotions. Abbey Arndt volunteered to lead devotions at the August meeting.

Adoption of the Agenda – Kathy Miller/Abbey Arndt moved/seconded the motion to approve the agenda as presented. Motion carried. **Next Meeting Date** – Tuesday, Aug. 17, 2010, 7:00 pm at Peace Lutheran Church.

Secretary's Report (additions/corrections) – Ken Rimer/Joy Grognet moved/seconded the motion to approve the minutes of the May meeting as printed in the June newsletter. Motion carried. **Treasurer's Report** – Starr White/Ken Rimer moved/seconded the motion to approve the report as presented. Motion carried. The General Fund balance as of June 30, 2010, was (\$5,242.55). The Bill Board will be brought back to encourage extra giving during the summer to cover operating expenses. Discussion followed on suggested non-profits to donate our May and June Benevolence funds to. Tracy Carlson/Sharon Hauschild moved/seconded a motion to give May's Benevolence of \$916.38 to Grace Place in Somerset, Wisconsin, and June's Benevolence of \$750.28 to the Baldwin Food Shelf. Motion carried. Suggestions for future donations included Kicking Bear in Michigan, Adoray, In Faith Volunteers and Living Waters Ministry in Guatemala. **Reports – Pastor** – Pastor Hanson reported that it's good to be back from his time at confirmation camp and the mission trips to Chicago and Kenya, but they were great experiences too. He received compliments on the worship services that our members led while he was gone and thanks those that led the services. The Chicago trip was very good. Our youth conducted themselves very well and represented themselves and Peace Lutheran Church very well during the trip no matter where they were, at the Shriner's Hospital, the bike shop, the senior center or any other place on their trip. We have youth to be proud of. Our mission trips to Kenya are changing the lives of the people who travel there and the people who live in Kenya. The Executive Committee met on Thursday, July 15 to discuss Peace Lutheran Church's thoughts on continuing as members of the ELCA or joining another church body such

as Lutheran Core or LCMC (Lutheran Congregations in Missions to Christ). Pastor John presented a document he is working on to present to our congregation addressing the 4 points of his battle of disagreement with the ELCA. A mailing will be going out before the end of July and discussion forums held in August. **Executive Committee** – President Carlson reported that the Exec. Comm. has met twice recently to discuss issues with the ELCA brought to the attention of the Council by various parishioners. We need to address them and will be involved in conducting discussion forums in August. Thank yous were passed around from Mallory Precht, Mark Serier, Lindsey Hurtgen, Baldwin Food Pantry, St. Croix Valley Habitat for Humanity, Mindy Gardner and David Burge. **Deacons** – Starr White reported with the full report printed elsewhere in this newsletter. **Education** – Finalizing Sunday School teachers for fall.
