## **Integrity**

Do you remember playing the telephone game as a kid? The game is played when one person reads or speaks a message to another person, and then it gets passed down the line until the last person receives the message and then speaks it out loud. The outcome is determined based on how the message changed from beginning to end. It was always interesting to hear what that final version of the message was.

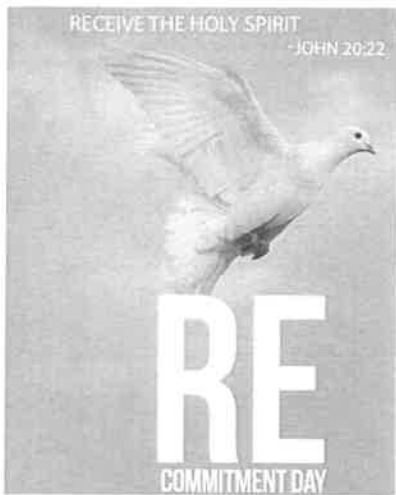
This game came to mind a couple of weeks ago while Pastor John was discussing the Gospel (Mark 8:27-38). In the reading, Jesus is explaining to his disciples that the Son of Man must undergo suffering, be rejected by the elders and chief priests, be killed, and then rise again after three days. Following this lesson, Peter takes Jesus aside and rebukes him. Jesus then says, "Get behind me, Satan!" Jesus then speaks of human things vs. divine things. After hearing the message from Pastor John, I started thinking that Peter, once he heard the message from Jesus, decided that he didn't like what he heard, so he wanted Jesus to change the message. I can't help but think that Peter was more concerned about how all of this was going to affect him, rather than pursuing what needed to be done.

Have you ever done that? That is, change the message so it fits more to your liking rather than what the message actually is? We of course are talking about integrity. I remember times when I was much younger, I would blame others for things that happened even when I was at fault. I have had others in turn do that to me as well. I have had parents do this to me regarding their child at school. We also see this every day in the news, especially in the political arena. Mis-trust and dishonesty seem to be an acceptable part of our society now. Where did we go wrong as people to allow this to be the norm?

As Christians, it is our responsibility to hold steadfast to the truth. We certainly can't control what other people say or do, but people of faith must continue to set the example through our actions and words, just as Jesus has taught us. Righteousness, humility, service and generosity are all a part of our integrity. I pray that through the integrity of our congregation, we can be the example that many others are looking for in their own lives.

## ***Annual Accounting of Our Membership***

We have invited the children to have a part in the service to lift up their skills and give them a chance to shine. We will follow the service with a potluck "early lunch" and encourage our people to mix and mingle a bit.

This Sunday celebration can set a focus and form a united effort on the part of our many ministries. To call us "Peace Lutheran Church" is to name each family as a part of our team and the very power that makes this ministry work.

This month every Member Family will receive a "RECOMMITMENT SURVEY" about the 15<sup>th</sup> of the month. Everyone is encouraged to fill out the survey that will be individually mailed to each address – and if you don't get one, stop in the office and get one so we have your information correct in our files. Every Member Family is encouraged to update their phone numbers and email addresses so that we can keep you informed on our work.

You are also being encouraged to consider participation in our faith life. We encourage you to worship with us on a regular basis. What is "regular?" Well, if you asked me you might not hear what you want to hear but know that I would encourage you to worship here as often as you are able.

You are being encouraged to consider participation in our programs. We have increased our staff to include a new Youth Director (Laurel Carlson) and added a new position of Director of Family Ministries (Pauline Wangen). We want to know how we as a church can help direct your children and your loved ones.

You are being encouraged to consider support for your church and its ministries. The reason this is last is because we really want to encourage you to worship with us and to get to know us through participation. After that, it isn't our place to tell you what your financial commitment "should" be. Instead, we ask that your commitment be what you are comfortable and willing to share. We then ask that you might do it freely, without coercion or guilt. We want you to be cheerful in your support of what God in Christ Jesus is doing in you, your family, your church, your community, our world.

Staying connected is very likely the most direct way we can encourage you make a commitment for you and your loved ones. When God chose us to be his children, and Jesus as our brother, God did so with a promise – "I will never leave you" and "I will be with you always, till the end of the age."

Will you do this for us this month? 1. Will you consider your invitation to worship with us. 2. Will you see what programs are available, or need to be offered in specific areas of personal interest. 3. Will you consider your support for this ministry in both time and finances – primarily as a cheerful giver! Then will you share the survey with our office. I pray that we might have a significant response to our mailing.

Your support and partnership in this mission called Peace Lutheran is only as powerful as the people who hear God's call to serve and who respond to his invitation to participate. Consider this an invitation to join us in worship, fellowship and support.

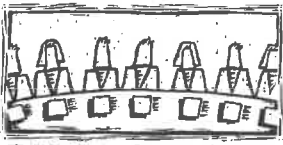
**Call to Order** – Chairman Jim Hauschild called the meeting to order at 9:15am.

## BOARD of TRUSTEES September 11, 2018

**Call to Order** – The meeting was called to order at 6:06 p.m.

**Next Meeting Date** – Tuesday, October 9<sup>th</sup> at 6:00 p.m.

**Approval of Secretary's Report** – Char Vrieze moved and Jon Veenendaal seconded approval of the secretary's report. Motion approved. It was requested by John V. that a reminder of the Trustees meeting be sent a week prior to the meeting.

**Treasurer's Report and Approval** – Jon Veenendaal moved and Char Vrieze seconded approval of the treasurer's report. Motion approved. John V. asked if the board could get the Treasurer's Report earlier than at the board meeting. Discussion followed. The Treasurer's Report will try to be distributed a day prior to the meeting.

**Old Business** – *Playground Update:* We need four inches of gravel, followed by landscape fabric, and then eight inches of playground chips. The existing space/ground needs to be bigger for the playset, 26 ft. x 41 ft. x 12 in deep. Pea gravel and chips will cost approximately \$1,200 and does not include the landscape fabric. Amy will let John V. know when the material is coming so he can dig the area. John V. said the stumps removed from Church Work Day were ground and need to be distributed. They will be buried as well as the old fill from the playground site. *Update on Lee Construction regarding soffits:* Rich

will call Lee Construction again. *Sidewalk update:* no update. *Undercoating for new bus:* no update. *Parsonage bid:* Siding material is 6-8 weeks out. Pastor John purchased windows when they were on sale for approximately \$10,000.00. New law came into effect that house has to be wrapped, which added approximately \$1,000 but even with this added cost, we are still under budget for the project. Terry Helgeson said he would put windows in but needed help and some folks will be helping. *Septic System/Sump Pump:* All done. Controls were also replaced. Very big kudos to Rich Carlson for the "dirty jobs" work he did to make it happen! *Stan Hanson mower update:* Rich Cronk picked it up. Char Vrieze moved and Rich Cronk seconded that the \$3,800 remaining balance for the mower (after sale of other equipment) come from the Historic/Grounds Fund. Motion approved. Amy will send a check. *Focus on Energy:* Lance was scheduled to come out and bid for LED lighting in the parking lot and when he did, Pastor John wasn't here, so they will be rescheduling. *Salary Input:* Extensive discussion occurred regarding compensation for employees. Will continue discussion next month.

**New Business** – None.

**Folder Items** – Notification was received by certified mail about doing work on the parsonage. Derek will be talking to Lance Peterson and/or Ken Rimer about why we received this notification.

Meeting adjournment was moved by Jon V. and seconded by John V. Motion approved. We closed with the Lord's Prayer at 7:47 p.m.
