...my perspective (words from our President)

Recovery

This past week I found myself having to go through a somewhat invasive medical procedure. From what I understand, the procedure was successful, and I should be back to normal operations by the end of this month. Anytime a person goes through a medical procedure or becomes injured, there will always be time set aside for recovery. This is a time to slow down and allow oneself to heal.

In my life, I have had my share of experiences with surgery. For me, not one of those experiences has been the same. I remember my first time going into surgery and the unsettling feeling I had of not knowing what to expect or what the outcome would feel like. It was an emergency appendectomy when I was about 25 years old. There were no options here I had to have this procedure done. At this time in my life, I was a person of very little faith, and the thought of putting my life in someone else's hands was terrifying. I remember the nurses telling me, "Relax, you are in good hands," and then they anesthetized me and that's all I remember. When I came out of it and got my bearings, I was in a hospital room and a nurse was there to greet me. I had no recollection of the surgery, but the four-inch sutured scar on my lower right side told me that something had been done (thank God for doctors and nurses!)

Now was the time for recovery! This recovery was very painful as the appendectomy called for cutting through a bunch of muscle tissue. When the pain meds wore off, I was in a great deal of pain. Not only that, they forced me to get up and start walking to wake my body up. I was praying to God, but far differently than I do now, if you get what I mean.

This was not the only medical procedure I had prior to receiving the Holy Spirit. In those days, I remember feeling like I was being punished for my past decisions and I spent a lot of time being angry. These days, I feel completely different about my life's journey because of my faith. I also know I have to remain cognizant of my faith, always knowing that God is with me at all times.

I understand how easy it is to lose faith when things are not going the way we would like them to. As the summer fast approaches and our schedules get filled with the events of the season, remember that it's important to take time to maintain our faith. Remember to attend church worship. Everybody needs a little Pastor John time! Take time to pray. Prayer is the key to unlocking the door and giving God some one on one time. Be grateful for all of the things we have. Take some time to have spiritual conversations with others. Continue to believe in yourself and have faith that all things are working for your good.

As many of us have gone through situations that require us to take time to recover, let us not put ourselves in situations where we have to take time to recover our faith. Summer is a very distracting time - don't let it distract you from your faith! Keep your faith strong. We can do all things with God!

“If we love one another, if we care for each other, will our sons and our daughters heed the call?”

John Ylvisaker, Lutheran Hymn Writer (1991)

As much as I am told I have the ability, it wouldn't be how Jesus orders us to disciple the world - the idea of a “lone soldier” carrying the ministry of the church is completely destroyed in Jesus' Easter proclamation. Jesus commands us to share his message. Our church asks each of us to commit to it.

This year's Easter Season readings from John's Gospel have primarily focused on Jesus' command to “love one another.” It is by the actions of those who believe that others will come to know the Good Shepherd. John 13:34-35 ³⁴*I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another.* ³⁵*By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another.*”

This proclamation of the Gospel is not only for the preacher but for everyone who claims the Christian faith. This message is also to be lived out in actions that bring the good news. This “faith action” is deeply rooted in our Lutheran heritage and is an important part of the way we commit ourselves to live out our belief. This command is tied to Holy Baptism, the Service of Affirmation of Baptism (Confirmation and New Members) and our worship on Recommitment Sunday (last Sunday in October). The question is asked of the candidate as well as the congregation and the people respond.

Do you intend to continue in the covenant God made with you in Holy Baptism:

- to live among God's faithful people,*
- to hear his Word and share in his supper,*
- to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed,*
- to serve all people, following the example of our Lord Jesus,*
- and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth?*

Response... “I do, and I ask God to help and guide me.”

Do you see that we are a “Co-Missioned People?” Can you hear what that means? We are asked to be ACTIVE in mission---TOGETHER. The work and mission of the church is not “one for all” (one person does the work of the commandment for the rest of the people) but rather, “all for one” (all people do the work of the commandment to point to Jesus). The action of inclusion is fully shared by “all!” Romans 10:13 says:

“Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved.”

It doesn't stop there. The next two verses identify those to whom we are sent and the importance of our active ministry to all those who see us – at home, at work, at play...on our way to or from...all the time... And the text closes giving praise to those active in this work. (Romans 10:14-15) ¹⁴*But how are they to call on one in whom they have not believed? And how are they to believe in one of whom they have never heard? And how are they to hear without someone to proclaim him? ¹⁵And how are they to proclaim him unless they are sent? As it is written, “How beautiful are the feet of those who bring good news!”*

The work of the church cannot be done by one or only a few. The chorus of John Ylvisaker's song puts the call to an active response at the heart of the Easter Gospel and Jesus' commandment. Shared actions of love will guide the next generation to a way of active mission that the world will notice and might come to believe.

Your church needs you for our outreach into the world. Volunteerism is important. Your hands are the least expensive way to maintain our facility and grounds. Your voice promotes our work in building the services we provide. Your offerings help us organize and facilitate the ministry. Your opinions help us focus our work to meet the needs of those we serve.

June 2, Work Sunday = One service at 8:00. Working together to care for our facilities. Potluck. Fellowship. We have a LOT of work to do and you are central to us completing it! Join us!
