Better, New, Improved. Is There Any Excellence in It?

We are bombarded every day with recommendations for us to make improvements to the way we live. With improved methods we cook, clean, work, learn, play, and even rest. We've changed our food and the way we prepare and eat it, our homes and the implements we use in them, the way we teach and learn, the way we do our jobs, and even the items we use at rest (C-Pap, white noise, sleep number). In its simplest form, we eat, we live, we learn, we work, and when exhausted, we sleep. In the end, we still do much the same and have little to show as a people who live "improved" lives.

In 1999 I was sent to a national assembly in Denver. At the assembly, there was a motion brought forward to make changes to improve being the church in the new millennia (2000 and beyond). This was a hotly debated motion that had been defeated in previous assemblies but was being reconsidered. I remember a statement made from the floor, "We took our dog to the groomer. It was bathed, dried, groomed, and combed. In the end, they presented it clean, with well-shaped fur and trimmed nails and a lovely bow around its neck. And with the bill in hand, it was still the same old dog. This, like my dog, is the same motion, just with a bow added to it." We considered the motion to "improve" ministries. In the end, it narrowly passed leaving a divided assembly.

Today, the church continues to battle the same challenges when new and improved methods are put in place so that our work is easier or better as in, "we don't have to do the work we don't want to do." The assembly leaders were looking for a new and improved way to direct the work of the church and little has been done to show improvement, even to today.

As Christians, we are called to something that is not new and to something that doesn't need improvement. Throughout the Bible, we are constantly being called to excellence. There are plenty of specific Bible verses about excellence, however just the simple call to be image-bearers of God is a call to excellence in itself. It will bring glory to God as well as show those around us the love of Christ. *"You are the light of the world. A city built on a hill cannot be hidden. Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead, they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven."*

The point of this letter is this - the really hard part of being a Christian is that our lives as "image-bearers of God" will naturally flow from us if we allow it and if we don't try and make it better or easier or new and improved. Think about this. Has baptism (the service of being called as a child of God) really changed in your lifetime or that of your elders? The answer is no! This is because baptism and inclusion in the family of God and living in unity with the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit is not about us - it's about God.

Being a person who lives by faith never was and likely never will be easy. Sin is always present and can be experienced in many forms. Sin will always try to redirect or to misinform us of the way we express our faith or the way we faithfully live our witness. Is there any excellence? 1 Corinthians 12:31, *"Now eagerly desire the greater gifts. And yet I will show you the most excellent way."* The way is LOVE.

My prayer for Peace Lutheran continues to be that we will be led by faithful people who will live out their faith in meaningful ways to the Glory of God, and that we will be a light to reveal God's glory to the world as an expression of love for our neighbor, our enemies, even ourselves. We still have work to do. Will you accept this invitation to join us?

January 11, 2021**

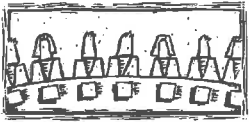

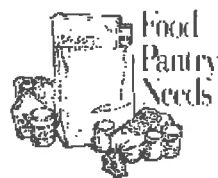

My testimonial about TOPS (Take Off Pounds Sensibly) -

I have always told myself that I can control my weight and I rarely got on the scale. Last May I realized I had better do something because I discovered that I weighed only 20 pounds less than my husband, who is 5’11”. I always thought my weight was fine because of the way my clothes fit. I considered various online weight control programs but chickened out questioning their validity. When I found out about TOPS (Take Off Pounds Sensibly) being offered at church, I thought I would give it a try. I am so very glad I did. Since I joined in June, I have lost 22 pounds and I have taken 5 grocery bags of clothes to Treasures because I have gone down one size. I am not stopping there. My goal is to lose 13 more pounds and then I will belong to the same group but instead I would be considered a KOPS (Keep Off Pounds Sensibly) member.



You may look at me and think, “Why does she need to lose weight?” In November of 2019 I found out that I have a chronic progressive lung disease called Bronchiectasis. There is no cure for this disease. It is very similar to COPD with the exception that mucous accumulates in the lungs. Since it is a lung disease, I am considered to be at high risk for Covid, which I am deathly afraid of getting. I thought by losing weight it would be easier on my lungs. I also have severe osteoporosis and receive yearly infusions for that. Again, I thought losing weight would be easier on my bones. I was always 5’7 ½” but I am now 5’6” due to bone loss.

I cannot express enough how happy I am that I joined TOPS. It is made up of very kind and caring people led by Pauline Wangen. New members are joining us all the time. If you have ever considered some sort of weight loss program, join us. Our members give presentations at every meeting that range from healthy recipes, knowledge of vitamins, exercises, charting your food intake and so much more. We applaud if you are present at the meetings, have lost weight, or have maintained weight. Everybody is treated with the same degree of respect because losing weight (no matter if it’s 25 pounds, 50 pounds or more) is a struggle for all of us. So, again, if you are considering joining us, you should! I know my goal can be reached with the support of my fellow TOPS members. - - - Gail Possley
