"United with Confidence by Prayer"

Bringing calm to anxious people is a significant part of ministry. Its roots are deep in our biblical tradition and our culture depends on many skill sets (and medications) to help alleviate anxiety. Most often, bringing calm is done with one or a few people in a secluded corner - rarely is it a crowd event. Calming can happen when many are present, but the focus is on the individual.

Uneasiness is no stranger to our congregation. Do you recall when we: hired a new pastor / purchased the electric organ to replace the church pipe organ / purchased the grand piano for worship / added full-time staff / purchased additional property /purchased our first bus and then #2, 3, and 4 / added missions in Guatemala and Kenya / decommissioned the White Church / affirmed building a new sanctuary / de-constructed the Red Church / resigned from ELCA then joined LCMC / to name <u>a few</u>. Add these communal trials to the many tragedies that have afflicted our families, and you can see that we have not only survived but flourished.

The precious gift that carried us through those uncertain times was when we proceeded as a community united in faith and mission. This unity is an important part of calming doubt and despair. I didn't say those were easy changes to deal with, but it was tolerable when we remained united.

I need to clarify something; I have not stated a timeline for retirement. Julie and I have not resigned from our partnership in the mission or ministry in this community. Our intention is to help build our ministry team to a point where the work we are doing together will continue for years to come. Consider the current chaos congregations are dealing with as they try to fill a sudden pastoral vacancy. Let's prepare.

Biblically, we are doing a proactive thing, the apostles in the early church devoted themselves to teaching, to fellowship, to sharing the sacraments, and to PRAYER — a time for discernment. Acts 2:42-47 NIV *The Fellowship of the Believers:* ^{2:42}*They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and prayer.* ⁴³Everyone was filled with awe at the many wonders and signs performed by the apostles. ⁴⁴All the believers were together and had everything in common. ⁴⁵They sold property and possessions to give to anyone who had need. ⁴⁶Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, ⁴⁷praising God and enjoying the favor of all the people. And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved.

In this Acts 2 passage, we often talk about the elements listed here that comprise the well-rounded church: teaching, worship, fellowship, mutual service, public proclamation, etc. But for today's theme, notice the emphasis that all of these elements were being done <u>together</u>.

Our church is opening itself to a new conversation that will likely increase our staffing in order to continue an effective ministry lasting into the future. Previously, this conversation was discouraged because the cost would have extended our debt. But now, the Board of Trustees has secured a portion of the 2023 budget to include additional Pastoral staff. The Council has formed a "Transition Committee" to listen to our community and to look for ways to meet our congregation's everchanging needs. I am offering my insights, not forcing my opinion. Still, this will require you to voice your hopes as well as your concerns as we move forward.

I am asking you to join in something Julie and I have done for many years, to pray for wisdom, for discernment, for unity. I am hoping you will continue with your prayers, support, and encouragement. We rely on you to share your vision for Peace so "the Lord will add to our number those who are being saved."

Bringing God's peace to a time of uncertainty happens when people are unified in focus, when we trust the work we perform, and when no one is left out of the conversation. Join us as we build our future on our past and our ministries for all our people.
