Obviously, not much lately due to the mild winter, so that's a big blessing, but who knows about next fall. Another member's blessing to the church was the lawn care, which hadn't cost us anything, but again, that is now an expense in our budget. We recently spent just over \$5000 on repairs to our bus. That transportation is a much needed part of our outreach programs. A new boiler had to be purchased and installed in the parsonage this winter, which again, was a much-needed repair but a surprise expense.

We all realize that our dollars don't go as far as they used to, and here at Peace we have the same situation. All I am asking is if we all could just throw in that "one dollar more" to help the church continue with its ministries. Please take it upon yourself to put some extra money in the offering box in the entryway, a pocketful of change in the noisy offering bucket, or see if it's in your heart to add that "one dollar more" into your already generous offerings! Because now, we are asking! God bless.

Talk About It or Get Around to It...

The season of Lent was set for us to remember the journeys to "Restoration" found in Noah and his family during the 40 days and nights of rain, found with Moses and the Israelites and their 40-year walk to freedom and the promised land, found with Jesus and his 40 days of wilderness temptations, and now, found in our 40 days of Lenten discipline. The journeys were to lead people into a newness of life. But we find ourselves returning to our old ways just like Noah and the Israelites, as well as the wanderings of Esau, Joseph, and Elijah, each in their own journeys. Jesus was the one who overcame and remained steadfast by relying on the promises of God. WHAT HOLDS US BACK?

Jesus, God's own son, the incarnated Word of God, fully understood something that we struggle with – the ability to face our faults, failures, and inadequacies in a direct manner. So, how did Jesus do it? How are we supposed to live this life "in bondage to sin and death?"

Our most fruitful ministry has been when we didn't have to sugarcoat the work of the church or make the work we do seem pretty or easy. Our most blessed work has been when we didn't have to go over, under, or around a struggle but go directly through it, like a wilderness adventure.

There were hard discussions in our years together. There is no need to review them here. The reality is that life in a community setting can be a struggle. "Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God; and the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus." (Philippians 6-7, NKJV)

Our church community is in a time of transition. It's a <u>wondering</u> time. Questions are asked about who will do what, how will we afford it, who will assist, will we ever get it done? The real emphasis needs to be on honest and open communication that is enhanced with prayer and thoughtful guidance. Did you know we start and end our Council meetings in devotion and prayer, just like our worship time? Did you know that we don't always agree or that we don't always have the right answer?

What amazes me is that when we come together with our abilities, our concerns, our offerings and our prayers and through direct communication with each other, we have accomplished many wonderful years of service and mission.

My prayer in this season of <u>wondering</u>, called LENT, is that we will find a clear direction for our transition to meet the worship and music needs in our church, that we will find skilled people to lead our children and youth in missions, that our education programs will have the structure that will guide our children to mission, and that our combined offerings will meet our financial needs. It isn't about who will cover all our needs, it is about how God will use each one of us in our work and witness.

Not being anxious, join us in honest conversations that are covered with prayer to discern the people that will guide us in ministry. Our shared concerns as well as abilities will direct our church to build upon what God has already done in our community, in Peace.
