CEMETERY NOTICE

To preserve the safety and tranquility of this sacred place, we kindly ask all caregivers and visitors adhere to the following:

1. **Landscaping**: No trees, shrubs, or flowers may be planted in the cemeteries.
2. **Maintenance**: Seasonal items shall be taken down by April 15 and October 15, respectively.
3. **Decorations**:
 - Artificial and natural flowers may be placed in pots on an elevated stand or a shepherd's hook, whereas the bottom of the pot is greater than 21 inches from the ground.
 - Only one stand or hook is allowed per grave site and should be positioned directly above the headstone.
 - Do not place wire decorations, trinkets, or glass vases on the ground.

Thank you for your cooperation, it is greatly appreciated and helps us maintain the cemeteries.

Forgiveness is Personal

For the fifth Lenten service, I talked about forgiveness – what it is, how we forgive, and how we have received it in Christ. One of the areas I touched on near the end of the sermon was the “*personal* nature” of forgiveness. By personal, I meant two things: first, God forgives *our* sins – not generically but specifically – what *you’ve* done. He knows you better than you know yourself. As we remember Good Friday and celebrate the Resurrection, this is something for us to hold on to. Forgiveness isn’t theoretical but personal, *for you*, based on what you’ve done, where you’ve been, the relationships that are hurting in your life, and more. Jesus died for YOUR sins. It’s not generic, it’s for you.

The second way in which forgiveness is personal is God’s command to extend forgiveness to others. In theory, we know we’re supposed to forgive, and we likely cheer that on and agree with it. However, forgiveness becomes much more difficult when we put skin and bone on it. To forgive someone who has wronged you is hard, especially if they haven’t said sorry and even more so when they’re not sorry.

Jesus pre-emptively forgave those who were crucifying Him. They didn’t apologize, repent, or go through a process of reconciliation. In the same way, He died on the cross for your sins long before you were born or could ever know of your sins. If He forgives pre-emptively and freely, we are called to do the same.

That’s something to reflect on as we go through Holy Week!

Free to Serve

Our faith story has a very strong pronouncement at worship services when we confess our sins. There is a statement of forgiveness that is connected to the work of Jesus, “For the sake of Jesus Christ, your sins are forgiven.” We are set free. It is not by our own abilities that we are redeemed from our faults, failures, or debts. It is done by the one who “came to save.” I think we as a church fail to teach that understanding of what it means to be set free.

To be free, by cultural standards, is to not have to pay, do, or be bound to anything. A free sample at the store means you can take the item without payment. But there is another free thing we fall into misunderstanding, that of the “if” clause. If you sign up with your mail address and phone number, we will give you this “free item” that now has a condition. If you give us your information, we will let you have this item and then bombard you with requests, special offers, and mailings that constantly remind you of what we gave you, for free!

That isn’t freedom, that is a form of bondage. It will require you to block, unsubscribe and recycle all sorts of materials. And if you block them, they will tell you how you can reconnect or ask if you really want to do this. Our culture wants to set hooks for a purpose and that is to make you dependent on a brand or service.

I think people who hear our words of absolution following confession will sometimes fall into a feeling of “Now what do I have to do?” Our faith story tells of the words from Jesus, “It is finished!” There aren’t additional steps to this redemption story, it is finished.

Sadly, Christ’s decree gets amended with requests for service on boards and committees and in classrooms or at events or for special offerings, “Because of what he did for you.” This is not part of the story. What Jesus said, just a few hours before he was crucified, was, “Do this to remember me” when he blessed the cup and the loaf, when he washed the feet of his disciples... Do this to remember me.

Our church is dependent on people to help us fulfill the command “to make disciples, to feed the hungry, to clothe the naked, to heal the sick.” But it isn’t done as a fulfillment of the gift of freedom. It is done to remember the one who came to save us from our sins, which is the very meaning of the name Jesus.

I personally ask you to come and share confession, come and hear the words of forgiveness, come and be set free. Then, without guilt, consider what Jesus has done for all of us and see what your fully redeemed body can do to remember and share that unconditional free gift of love. It’s yours to give.

BOARD of TRUSTEES

February 18, 2024

Call to order: Wes called the meeting to order at 9:20 a.m.

Those attending were Weston Arndt, Cole Tobin, Chris Iverson, Dick Ulrich, Scott Brushaber, Cristy Peavy and Christian Magnell. Pastor John Hanson attended part of the meeting, Amy Hutchins was absent.

Secretary's Report: Minutes from the January meeting were emailed to all in attendance, hard copies were available. Cole made a motion to approve the minutes and Chris seconded. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report: Cristy explained there were several make up payments made for January and December causing high expenses, including pension and housing equity payments. Also, payroll taxes were paid for the month. The parsonage flooring and new parsonage boiler were paid from the building fund. Moving expenses were also paid in January from the general fund. Miscellaneous income was negative due to the timing for Scrip card purchases. Discussed the expected cash flow challenges and communication to the congregation. Wes made a motion to approve the treasurer's report and Cole seconded. Motion carried.

Old Business:

1. Endowment Fund – Looking at later dates to invite Joan Bartz to a meeting.
2. Peace Child Care – Cole reported that an end of the year report was being prepared. Continued discussion regarding insurance. Planning \$2,100 payment to Peace for workers compensation. Discussed cost share options for snow removal. PCC now accepting 2-year-olds.
3. Succession planning – Discussed musician/worship assistant and Youth on Fire as current priorities.
4. Facility Maintenance –
 - a. Countryside was called due to failed furnace igniter impacting the daycare

classroom area. Also found another igniter failing in unit above kitchen.

- b. Roof improvements: Following up with insurance regarding payment/reimbursement for the emergency repairs prior to winter.
 - c. Parsonage improvements: Rich inquired about a water softener for the parsonage.
 - d. Will plan to paint Sunday School classrooms after Sunday School year.
 - e. Bus required repairs, with a reduced cost still totaling over \$5,000.
 - f. Pastoral Office Space – Discussed John and Christian's current use of space.
 - g. Fellowship hall air conditioning – Signed contract with Countryside to move ahead in the spring. New quote was lower than initial proposal.
5. Farmland Rental – Josh Newton accepted the offer to farm the land east of the parking lot.

New Business:

1. Cole stated the facility assessments estimate was about \$7,500, but this number could be reduced with a narrowed scope. Itemized list will be shared at the next meeting.
2. Summer Grounds Care – Colin Iverson and Kale Polk have agreed to return as summer help. Christian stated Noah has also expressed interest in helping as well.
3. Wes was appointed the chair and Cole was appointed secretary.

Next meeting date: TBD. **Next council representative:** Wes – Attended the February 20 meeting. Dick scheduled for March 19. **Next month's review of books:** Weston and Chris.

Adjournment: Motion by Cole and second by Chris to adjourn at 10:20 am, and we closed with the Lord's Prayer.

BOARD of TRUSTEES March 10, 2024

Call to order: Wes called the meeting to order at 9:15 a.m. Those attending were Weston Arndt, Cole Tobin, Chris Iverson, Scott Brushaber, Jared Peterson, Cristy Peavy and Amy Hutchins. Willy and Carol Zevenbergen attended part of the meeting to discuss the cemetery rules.

Secretary's Report: Minutes from the January meeting were emailed to all in attendance, hard copies were

available. Chris made a motion to approve the minutes and Scott seconded. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report: Cristy pointed out that the offerings were higher than anticipated and that there was a large gift made to help the higher operating costs. It was discussed that some members are giving their whole year's offering at one time to help the church through the higher operating costs. We discussed that while this is a huge blessing and is helping the church continue to operate, we cannot (cont)

wait until these funds are gone to talk to the church body about what it requires to continue operating. It was agreed that it would be much better to be proactive and communicate regularly with the members on where the church is financially. Also discussed the costs for the electrical connections for the fellowship air conditioning being about \$3,000, which the current funds set aside for the project should cover. Cole made a motion to approve the treasurer's report and Jared seconded. Motion carried.

Old Business:

6. Endowment Fund – Removed from the old business until a later date.
7. Peace Child Care – Cole reported that the 2 yr. old program has their first child and that they have multiple tours scheduled for the 2 yr. old program. PCC is continuing to work on their taxes, updating their pricing, and handbooks. PCC is working on purchasing more material for the playground which was flagged in an inspection. PCC would prefer rubber chips but due to costs for materials, it was decided to top-dress the existing wood chips with new wood chips for now and replacing with rubber could be revisited at a later date.
8. Succession planning – Discussed that based on conversations and announcements, that it was the Trustees' belief that the Transition Team is addressing the need for musician/ worship assistant and Youth on Fire, and once it was decided, Trustees would be responsible for budgeting the funds.
9. Facility Maintenance –
 - a. Roof improvements: Followed up again with insurance regarding payment/ reimbursement for the emergency repairs prior to winter.
 - b. Will plan to paint Sunday School classrooms after Sunday School year.
 - c. Pastoral Office Space – Discussed John and Christian's current use of space.
 - d. Fellowship hall air conditioning – Funds set aside for the air conditioning project should be enough to cover the electrical hookups as well.
 - e. A/V – Sam got two different prices on new headset microphones. Wes proposed

to talk with John and Christian about their preference on having headset microphones or possibly using the pulpit microphone.

New Business:

4. Cole stated the facility assessments estimate was about \$7,500, but this number could be reduced with a narrowed scope. Itemized list will be shared at the next meeting.
5. Summer Grounds Care – Colin Iverson and Kale Polk have agreed to return as summer help. Christian stated Noah has expressed interest in helping as well.
6. Willy and Carol met with the Trustees to discuss the cemeteries:
 - a. There are currently two headstones that have tipped over due to plants that have overgrown and their roots have pushed them over. This is a major safety concern and will need to be addressed.
 - b. Amy is going to send out the current by-laws for the cemetery for review and the Trustees will work on pulling out the main rules for emphasis of use and upkeep to put on signs that can be posted at each cemetery.
 - c. Shrubs and plants will need to be cut back/removed to eliminate their root systems from continuing to tip over headstones.
 - d. All plants will need to be in plant stands or on shepherd's hooks to avoid any more issues with headstones as well as helping the grounds crew in the maintenance of the cemetery.
 - e. Discussed ways to post and inform that all seasonal items need to be removed by April 1 and October 15.

Next meeting date: April 14th @ 9:15am. **Next council representative:** Scott and Dick switched meeting dates. Scott – March 19th. Dick April 16th. **Next month's review of books:** Cole and Scott.

Adjournment: Motion by Chris seconded by Scott to adjourn at 10:20 am, and we closed with the Lord's Prayer.

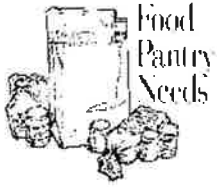
