double up on benevolence last month, so it will be skipped for the month of April to even out. All funds from equipment sales will be put into the Building Fund. Wes asked for us to think of ideas for silent auction goal ideas. Chris made a motion to accept, and Cole seconded. Motion carried.

Old Business: Women's grab bars - Delivered. Need to be installed. FA Covers - Delivered and installed. Ice Machine - The damaged one was picked up; waiting for a delivery date for the replacement one. Mowing - Jim and Allie are moving forward with mowing for this year. Trustees approved paying \$18/hr for this year. Jared made a job description for future years. Chris and Kevin (cont.)

are going to give them a tutorial on equipment use as well as where they need to mow. Jim will not be here until the end of May. Trustee Calendar - Cole presented Trustee calendar to be printed out and added to the Trustee folder. Added cemetery cleanup for the spring and fall. Also added, spring and fall HVAC maintenance. Countryside Maintenance Contract – Trustees decided not to hire Countryside on for a service contract. Joel recommended hiring Brian Montpetit to look at where our equipment is at and to train Kevin on things to check. Trustees approved moving forward with this. Joel is going to reach out to Brian and coordinate the schedule with Kevin. Signage – Approved getting the church sign refinished. Cole is going to get pricing to replace it with an acrylic sign to avoid rust. Solar project – Wes met with solar company to discuss three different pricing options to see what the different costs would be. Youth Leader Position - Cole sent out the job description Sarah made as well as the rough projection of the hours that it would take to do the job. Discussed different options for how to move forward with this position. Jared is going to run a couple of different cost projections so that we can make an informed decision. Cole to let Sarah know that we are working on it. Employee Review – Jared sent the reviews out to all of the employees. He is going to send out the rubrics and a list of who is reviewing each person to all the trustees.
