BOARD of EDUCATION May 12, 2025

Amy, Laurie, Mikaela, Missi, and Nicole were present at the May 12th meeting. The team recapped April's activities and council meetings: Mikaela will be attending the May 20th council meeting. In the Sunday School Director's report, it was noted that a meeting is scheduled for May 28th with Becky, Laura, and Pastor Chris to review the calendar. Rally Day is planned for September 7th, with a bounce house to be booked. There will be no Sunday School on December 28th or January 4th, and a Saturday night Christmas program is being considered. Spring Break will also include a Sunday School break on March 15th. Curriculum has not yet been ordered, but Sunday School class sheets are nearly complete and postcards for incoming 3-year-olds will be sent out by the end of summer.

For Family Ministries, May and June efforts will focus on supporting UNITED Fire and Rescue by preparing

snacks and baskets for stations in Baldwin, Hammond, and Woodville, feeding approximately 75 people. A request will be made for \$500 to purchase additional snacks.

Plans for this year's Vacation Bible School (VBS) were also reviewed. Laurie and Mikaela will attend Monday, Wednesday, and Thursday; Amy will attend Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday; Kennedy is likely available as well. A free will offering of \$5 per day is suggested. The daily schedule includes dinner from 5:00–5:30, music and Bible story (with Laura) from 5:30–5:45, crafts and activities from 5:45–6:15, games from 6:15–6:45, and closing prayers from 6:45–7:00. Specific VBS roles include Laurie leading Imagination Station for older kids (Amy covering on Tuesday), Kennedy handling crafts for younger kids, Mikaela and Amy organizing games (with Angela assisting), and Missi in charge of snacks.

BOARD of TRUSTEES May 14, 2025

Call to Order: 6:06. Those in attendance were Jared, Kevin, Cole, Joel, and Amy. Scott joined by phone. Chris joined for part of the meeting.

Secretary's Report: Joel made a motion to approve. Scott seconded. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report: Amy presented the treasurers' report, this past month giving exceeded expenses. Amy brought up that May will be a three-payroll month and going into summer. We did receive the payment of \$15K for the skid steer and the funds were put into the Building Fund. The attachments for the skid steer and grasshopper are at Smith Auction but we have not heard if they were

sold. Discussed the possibility of selling the truck, there is someone who expressed interest in buying it. Trustees agreed to move forward with looking to sell the truck. Cole made a motion and Joel seconded. Motion carried. Facilities: Joel got a proposal to have someone provide an HVAC and kitchen equipment review for \$500 not including parts. There was also a proposal for \$1200 for a maintenance schedule with pictures and step by step instructions. And also a proposal for quarterly maintenance at a rate of \$500/quarter, including cleaning chemicals, which includes five hours of work and a rate of \$60/hr afterwards. Trustees approved hiring Brian MontPetit to do an assessment and maintenance schedule. We would like to get the assessment and schedule from Brian before we decide on hiring for ongoing maintenance. (cont.)

- Discussed adding this to an ongoing schedule. Amy is going to continue to add items that she knows are done on a regular schedule. Asked the question if annual inspections are done on the fire alarm system, especially with PCC and Sunday school in the building.
- Broken windows there is a broken window in the parsonage and one in the church basement. Jared is going to look at the one in the basement and Cole is going to follow up with Jim Hauschild about the parsonage window.
- New ice maker was delivered and will be set in place tonight so that water lines can be hooked up.
- Joel made a list of items that he had found from multiple walk throughs to ask questions about or need to be addressed.
- Joel brought up looking at the retaining wall by the cemetery and Amy brought up the wall on the west side of the church.
- Kevin said that the grasshopper is working well but the large Toro died a couple of times. After looking into it the switch is bad, and we are waiting on the replacement one. Kevin said that the smaller Toro controls are very jerky when the switch is in, and he will look at it.

Old Business: Women's grab bars - these have all been installed. FA Covers - delivered and installed. Ice Machine – this will be set tonight so waterlines can be hooked up. Signage - approved getting the church sign refinished. Cole is going to get pricing to replace it with an acrylic sign to avoid rust. Solar project - No update. Youth Leader Position - Jared is going to work on projecting what the cost would be. Cole sent out the job description Sarah made as well as the rough projection of the hours that it would take to do the job. Discussed different options for how to move forward with this position. Jared is going to run a couple of different cost projections so that we can

make an informed decision. Cole to let Sarah know that we are working on it. Employee Review - Jared sent the reviews out to all of the employees. He is going to send out the rubrics and list of who is reviewing each person to all the trustees.

New Business: Laura presented the need for an A/V person. It has been a challenge to have consistently good results with the sound control. This person would need to be at the church on Sundays and Wednesdays, and Laura estimated this position would be needed for 10-15 hours a week. Laura also said that the sound board is currently maxed out on available channels and an extension is needed. In the meantime, she is going to swap the pulpit mic for a wireless one. Sam is working on getting quotes for the different options. Laura has talked to a couple of people to gauge interest in the position. Laura brought up that the stage layout is no longer handicap accessible, and we will need to coordinate redoing the ramp access. Bus settlement – our insurance reported that the company came back with a settlement offer of \$1100. We voted to reject the offer, and Amy is going to forward the email chain to Jared and Jared is going to reach out to an attorney to have a letter drafted. Cameras at the parsonage - Christian requested help for installing the camera with a floodlight that requires being hardwired. Procedures - all need to review the procedures that Jared provided at the last meeting to provide feedback. Work Order Procedure -Jared also made a guideline for people to request work to be done around the church. Benevolence - Jared made a procedure for benevolence requests for people to give to different causes as well as for members to be able to request financial help in times of need. Vision Planning Committee – Jared made a list of guiding principles for the long-term facility needs of the Church. Began making a preliminary list of who should be a part of it.

Next meeting is on 6/8 at 11:30am. Chris made a motion to adjourn and Cole seconded. Motion carried. Meeting ended at 8:18pm.
