Psalm 53 – Devotional Thought:

Earlier this month the man with the world's highest recorded IQ - 276! - Dr. YoungHoon Kim, a South Korean scientist, declared on social media "As the world's highest IQ record holder, I believe that Jesus Christ is God, the way and the truth and the life." I read the article and his social media post. Not knowing anything about him, I can't verify the claim and certainly not what's in his heart, but it's interesting.

However, as we will speak about today, accepting Christ or even acknowledging the existence of God is not a matter of intelligence but a matter of wisdom. It doesn't matter how intelligent you are, to reject the existence of God is not a matter of education or intelligence. It is a matter of wisdom versus foolishness.

We are called to pursue wisdom. The book of Proverbs is a great example of this, but it applies to all of Scripture. The Spirit will teach you, guide you, and demonstrate wisdom. The question: are we willing to learn?
