Psalm 110 – Devotional Thought:

I was listening to KFAN a couple of weeks ago. The hosts were debating whether or not they would remain fans of the Vikings if you could look into the future and know they would never win a Super Bowl in their lifetime. I know I would for a couple reasons: first, they've never won one and I've managed to exist just fine (and I'm not old enough to remember them even playing in one); second, I'm already working with the assumption it won't happen in my lifetime!

But of course we can't see the future for our sports teams or other actually important parts of our lives. There is one exception of course, and that is Scripture. Today's Psalm looks ahead to the future (from around 980 BC) and foretells the victory of Jesus over sin, death and the devil. David knew he could look forward to his descendent achieving the ultimate victory, as God took on flesh in Jesus Christ and walked among us.

In a world of uncertainty, we can put our hope and trust in the truest thing ever – the love of God for us and his victory in grace and mercy!
